No one else was around. [REDACTED] came in and sat with us. I immediately got up and moved to the other end of the bench.

Doug,

I was initially inclined to let these incidents slide, but given that the same type of thing keeps recurring, I would like to at least document this for now.

Perhaps after you get [REDACTED] we can tackle this problem. In the meantime, do feel free to share with Peter, if you want.

In a nutshell, [REDACTED] continues to insert [REDACTED] in what others have termed "odd ways" into my and my family's life.

\* At Houston's playoff football game [REDACTED] came to the stadium at half time and sat down beside the friends I was sitting with. Interrupting the conversation multiple times. There were plenty of other places to sit. I had been in the same spot, working on writing an article, the whole game. Afterwards, both [REDACTED] expressed that they were perplexed why [REDACTED] did this and thought it was odd.

\* At Harrison's first playoff game [REDACTED] sat right behind Hannah in the student section. This is not the first time [REDACTED] has sat behind Hannah. Hannah and her friends noticed [REDACTED] staring at them. They attempted to ignore her, but Hannah thought it was strange and it made her uncomfortable. Again, there were plenty of other places to sit.

\* At the junior high I was dropping off glasses for a coworker at the student store. [REDACTED] positioned herself outside the cafeteria doorway and stared at us both. The gentleman, [REDACTED], remarked that [REDACTED] had made an odd comment to him about the glasses. This was none of [REDACTED] business and [REDACTED] could have moved somewhere else, [REDACTED] shift was in the cafeteria.

\* Hannah was shopping with her grandparents at Pioneer Place on Black Friday. They went into [REDACTED] only because [REDACTED] had said [REDACTED] never worked on Fridays when she had Houston. Hannah was looking at sweaters. [REDACTED] came running out from a back room, straight up to Hannah and asked if [REDACTED] could help her. Hannah said no, and she turned and told her grandparents she wanted to leave. This was uncalled for, [REDACTED] could have stayed in the [REDACTED] room doing what [REDACTED] was doing and let another [REDACTED] help.

\* Saturday at Houston's basketball practice, [REDACTED] came in and inserted [REDACTED] into a conversation my brother was having with [REDACTED]. My brother was gracious and tried to make light of it, but [REDACTED] was very uncomfortable. [REDACTED] brought it up with me later and said [REDACTED] thought [REDACTED] was trying to make [REDACTED] uncomfortable and the conversation was odd.

\* During a fire drill at the Junior High [REDACTED] was on the back field with [REDACTED] dog. Daniel said [REDACTED] was staring at him and acting weird. [REDACTED] wasn't there to [REDACTED] rather to exercise [REDACTED] dog at the school during school hours. There are other places [REDACTED] could have gone.
